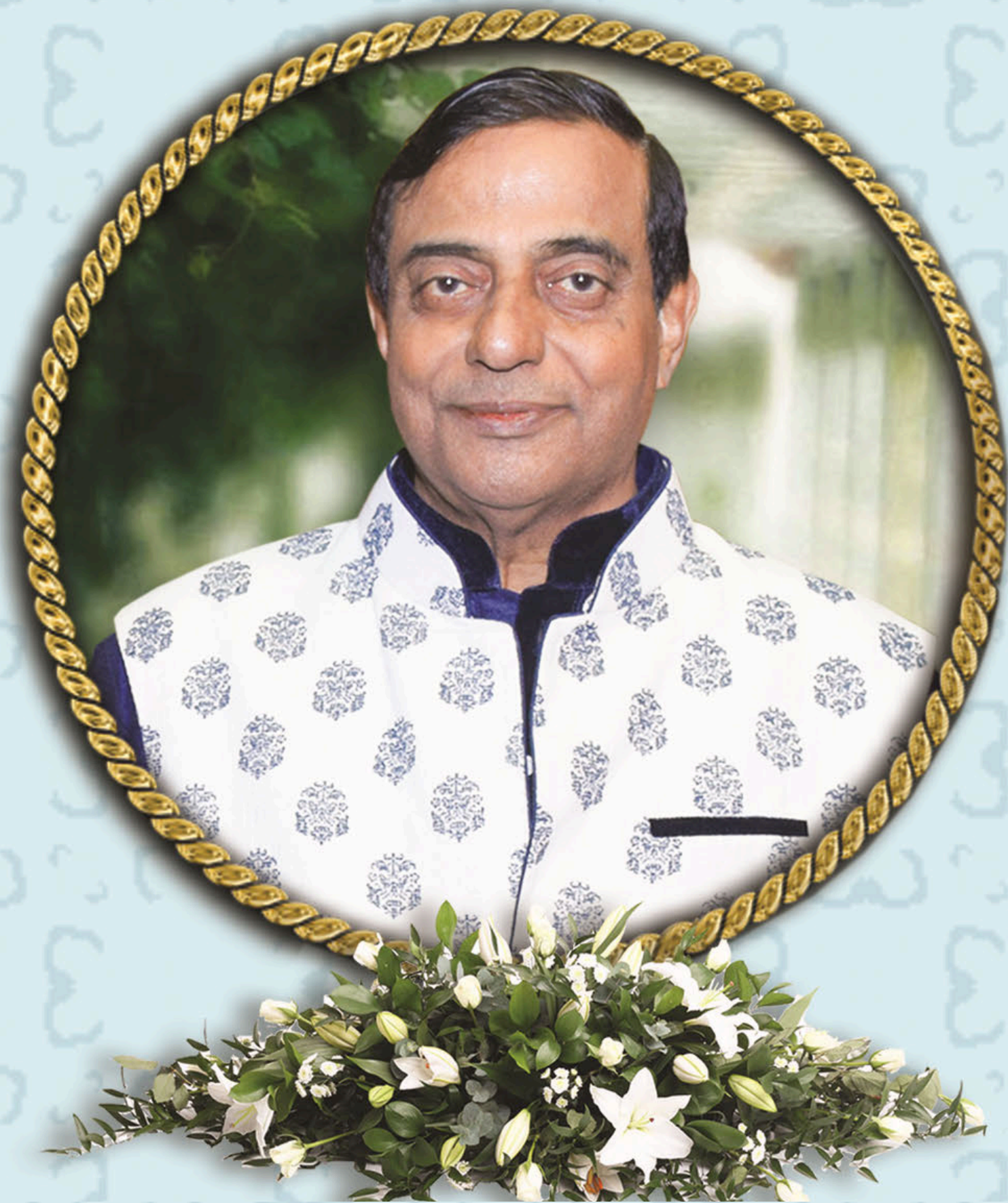

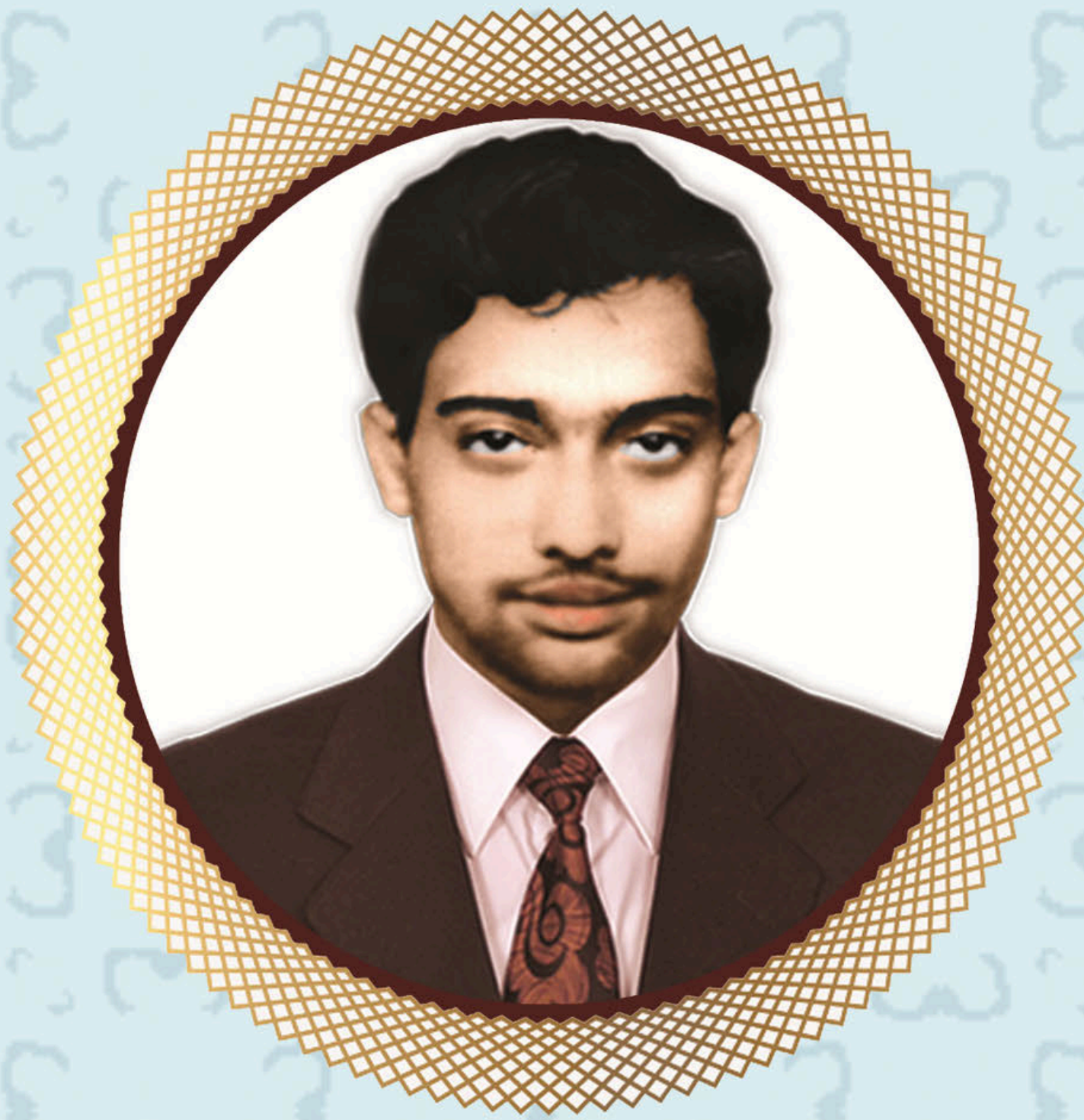

He possessed a very special knack for science subjects and thereby he comfortably passed Computer Engineering from B.I.T Bangalore obtaining First Class marks. He was going to join Motorola Group of Companies but death departed him from all that he had. Above all, he was in love with poetry and he also spilt ink to write quite a good number of which are deeply passionate.

During his brief span of life, he always wanted to make his services available for the society in which he lives. Ramanuj had his dreams and vision. In order to make his dreams a reality, an initiative taken up to set up "Ramanuj Gupta Memorial Charitable Trust". The main objective of the Trust is 'Service to the poor with potentialities'. The Trust believes in heart and soul that "God loveth a charitable giver'. The maiden venture of the Trust is the establishment of one full-fledged Science College here at Silchar, situated in the southern part of Assam. The College would be known as "Ramanuj Gupta Junior College" and a good number of renowned educationists and veteran teachers of this town have been extending their helping hands in all possible ways to make this project a great success. Today, Ramanuj Gupta Junior College has established its distinct identity in providing quality education in Arts and Commerce streams alongwith the Science stream at both H.S. level and it is matter of great pride that its alumini are now well-placed in different professions located in India and abroad.

Dr. Rahul Gupta a renowned physician and the founder father of Ramanuj Gupta Memorial Charitable Trust who left us in the gear of grief with his sudden demise on account of cerebral attack on 16th Aug 2016 had a cherished dream to establish Degree College in the sacred memory of his beloved son Ramanuj, with a mission and vision to fulfil the dream of Dr. Gupta, the Ramanuj Gupta Charitable Trust immediately after his sad demise, took allout initiative to translate Dr. Gupta's dream into practice and accordingly Ramanuj Gupta Degree College emerged on 30th July 2017 having received the affiliation of Assam University. Under the patronage of Late. Dr. Rahul Gupta, a philanthropic organization 'Ramanuj Gupta Memorial Charitable Trust' was established in the year 2002, to perpetuate the memory of his late son Ramanuj Gupta, who tragically passed away at a young age. Initially, the trust sponsored a senior secondary college named 'Ramanuj Gupta Junior College' (presently known as, *Ramanuj Gupta Senior Secondary School*), under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Guwahati, from the academic session of 2002-2003, as part of a comprehensive programme that included future plans to initiate a full-fledged degree college.

The Trust in a bid to fulfill the long cherished dream of Late Lamented Founder President Dr. Rahul Gupta and to honor the requests from a section of the guardians, decided to start a degree college namely “Ramanuj Gupta Degree College” from the academic session 2017-2018, under Assam (Central) University, Silchar. It commenced initially on 30th July, 2017, with B.Com. and B.A. (Pass & Honours) courses, with an unstinted commitment to academic excellence. Eventually, the college was upgraded to a full-fledged degree college with the introduction of B.Sc. (Pass & Honours) courses in 2019. It is the only private-funded degree college in Barak valley that that offers undergraduate courses in Arts, Commerce, and Science (Both, Honours and Pass courses). In a brief amount of time, the college has already achieved many significant milestones in its academic journey towards excellence.

The Aims and Objectives:

The Aims and Objectives of the Institution is to impart education in a conducive environment through intensive teaching followed by periodical assessment and to help the students in development of their demeanor and personality in order to achieve maximum proficiency in all the subjects of study in the Graduation level.

The Mode of Teaching:

The mode of teaching and administration will be different from the stereo typed ones and will be designed to derive maximum benefit by the students and thereby enabling them to be disciplined and self-confident. Keeping the aesthetic sense in mind the buildings, classrooms, Library etc. have been designed for the students. The most highlighting feature of the teaching learning process of the College is that by accepting the challenge of pandemic lockdown and holistically following the norms of social distancing, RGDC has not only introduced usual online modes of teaching but also it has installed its own indegenious App “Ramanuj Gupta Degree College Silchar” through which the uninterrupted teaching learning process is carried on.

The Teaching Sector:

In the teaching sector, it will be a blending of the experiences gained through decades by the persons of repute in the respective field and the energy and dedications of the young new entrants.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

ADMISSION PROCESS:

- a) The process of admission to FYUG B.A./ B.Com./ B.Sc. for first year classes will start immediately after the declaration of results of Higher Secondary or any other equivalent examinations and the result of CUET, on the dates notified by the college administration.
- b) Students will be admitted purely on the basis of their merit.
- c) The **Admission Form** along with **Prospectus** can be obtained from the college website/ college office during the working hours on the specified date and time as notified.
- d) Admission can be taken only in offline mode. However, fees can be paid through both online and offline mode, after the **announcement** of the selection list for admission.
- e) Students must abide by the schedule of admission as notified by the college administration in the college notice board.
- f) The Ramanuj Gupta Memorial Charitable Trust extends monetary support to poor meritorious students with very high percentage of marks and having a strong bent of mind to pursue higher education through admission fee relaxation.

ADMISSION FEE:

All fees other than University Registration Fees & Examination Fees will have to be paid at the time of Admission to First Year (For, 1st & 2nd Semester). Subsequently, the student need to pay the fees in the Second Year (For, 3rd & 4th Semester), Third Year (For, 5th & 6th Semester), and Fourth Year (For, 7th & 8th). The details will be displayed in the college notice board time-to-time.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION:

The student should submit the copies of the following documents along with the Application Form for admission. The student must also produce the original copies of these documents at the time of counselling for verification.

- a. 2 copies of recent passport size coloured photographs
- b. Photocopy of Marksheet of the H.S Final/ Equivalent examination passed
- c. Photocopy of Admit card of the H.S Final/ Equivalent examination passed
- d. Photocopy of the Certificate of H.S Final/ Equivalent examination
- e. Self-Attested Photocopy of PAN Card of parent/ guardian
- f. Permanent Address proof (Photocopy of recent Electricity/ Telephone Bill)
- g. Gap Certificate (in case of any gap after passing H.S Final/ Equivalent Exam)

FYUG GUIDELINES

- a) As per the guidelines of NEP 2020 & Assam University, Silchar, the duration of the under-graduate courses is of four (4) years (FYUG). Each year of which comprises of two (2) semesters.
- b) The medium of instructions shall be **English** except programmes/ courses/ subjects/ topics in Modern Indian Languages.
- c) The FYUG Programme provides an opportunity for the students to choose from the prescribed curriculum comprising **DSC** (Discipline Specific Core) and **DSM** (Discipline Specific Minor), **IDC** (Inter Discipline Course), **AEC** (Ability Enhancement Course), **VAC** (Value Added Course) and **SEC** (Skill Enhancement Course).
- d) Both **DSC** and **DSM** should be selected from within either of the following clusters. Same subject cannot be selected as **DSC**, **DSM**, and **IDC**.
- e) Students should opt for two **DSM**, one as first minor and the other as second minor.
- f) Opting one literature as **DSC** and other literatures as **DSM** and **IDC** is not allowed.

➤ **ATTENDANCE :**

- a) Regular Attendance is must for each and every student.
- b) Non- Attendance of classes by the students is viewed seriously by the college Authority and actions as deemed fit will be taken against the defaulting students. Incase of Online Classes through RGDC App, there is the provision for attendance counting (online) which will be duly considered.
- c) Unless a student attends a minimum number of classes held in each subject as fixed by the Authority, the student shall not be allowed to appear in the Final/University's Examinations.
- d) Class Attendance shall be calculated on the basis of actual number of classes held during each semester in each course/paper. Number of decimal be rounded off to next higher number (e.g., 74.01% be rounded off to 75%)
- e) A student with less than 75% of attendance on an average of all the papers (excluding NCP Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall NOT be allowed to appear in that ESE but will be allowed to take admission in the immediate next higher semester. However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar ESE (odd/even) in all the papers and, marks to be awarded under CCA for each paper shall be the marks previously secured by the student in the concerned paper, only if the student secure Pass marks in the Unit Test else he/she shall have to appear in Unit Tests in the concerned paper along with the regular students.

- b) General Black Shoes & Navy-blue socks for both boys and girls which can be purchased from any shoe store.
